2022 CHAPTER TEACHER OF THE YEAR

Ms. Lena Weatherford, a fifth-grade science teacher at Chiefland Elementary School, is the Air and Space Forces Association Red Tail Memorial Chapter 136 Teacher of the Year. Ms. Weatherford received the award on May 18 from Chapter President Ben Langer and Member Larry Stanley during an after-school faculty social in the school. The award recognizes classroom teachers for their efforts to get students excited about science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM).

"We hope that students who excel in math and science will go on to make big contributions in the high tech world that we live in today, maybe even in the U.S. Air or Space Force," Langer said. "Good teachers are a direct path to success for students, and we think that Ms. Weatherford is one of the best." She has been a teacher for 33 years, including stints in front of second, third and fourth grades as well as her current fifth grade class.

Chiefland Elementary School Principal Deanna Feagin recommended Ms. Weatherford for the award. "Mrs. Weatherford not only understands the great value in building relationships with her students, but she is also skilled in implementing thoughtful and engaging hands-on lessons for them," Ms. Feagin stated.

Her daughter, Megan Snyder, a third-grade teacher also at Chiefland Elementary, went further: "My mom inspires me every day. She never stops working. Even in the summer, my mom is working on lesson plans and activities to use during the coming school year." Wayne Weatherford, the Teacher of the Year's husband, claims that his wife would teach "even if they didn't pay her. She loves it that much."

After 33 years, is Ms. Weatherford going to quit teaching? "Nope, I don't know what else I would want to do," she said.

As the Red Tail Memorial Chapter 136 Teacher of the Year, Ms. Weatherford received an award certificate, an Air Force Association portfolio, Chapter Teacher of the Year pin, complimentary one-year membership in the Air and Space Forces Association with an accompanying subscription to Air Force Magazine, and a no-strings-attached check for \$250.

2022 CHAPTER TEACHER OF THE YEAR

The Silver River Museum and Environmental Education Center is a program of Marion County Schools. The museum has been in operation since 1991 and sees students who attend on field trips during the school year. Students focus on science and Florida history, visit the museum and science lab, and take part in nature hikes and eco-tours of the Silver River aboard the museum boat.

Erin Benavides has worked as the Resource Teacher since 2018 and coordinates all curriculum and field trip activities for the program. Ms. Benavides has inspired tens of thousands of students since joining the museum staff. She always gets rave reviews from both students and teachers attending the field trips... "best program ever."

Prior to coming to the museum Ms. Benavides was a classroom teacher, science curriculum coach for other teachers and she also organized the Big Springs Science Fair (a three-county STEM fair) here in Marion County for several years. Ms. Benavides has a strong background in science and easily translates this depth of knowledge to the classroom.
